Grade One News May 2016



<u>Language</u>: Daily 5 has been such a hit with the classes. The Grade I's have become such avid writers. The kids are writing in the writing folders every chance they get! We love seeing this passion in them. Kids working with Mrs. Parker have even started writing letters to their peers which has been VERY fun to respond to. We have introduced how to writing as well and we definitely have some creative minds in our classes. We have just about finished up with our Grade I tricky words and will be working on reinforcing them throughout the rest of the month.

<u>Math:</u> In April all of the classes completed their "Measurement" unit. We tried something different this year: each class rotated to the different teachers to learn different ways to measure. Mrs. Secretan taught about capacity, Mrs. Rarick and Mrs. Meeks taught about area, Miss Longjohn taught weight and Miss Larsen taught length and height. It was very fun to mix around the community and have different teachers every week in Math! During the classes we have measured and compared objects. It has been VERY hands on and entertaining In May we will be working on our unit "2D and 3D Shapes". We will still be reinforcing addition and subtraction throughout the month. We have talked about length, height and area.

<u>Science (Miss Larsen):</u> We completed our unit "Seasonal Changes: Spring" and started our new unit "Needs of Plants and Animals". This unit started with examining the difference between living and nonliving things. The classes even got to play with real worms while comparing them to gummy worms. Our unit progressed to looking at animal adaptations. Your child should be able to tell you about different kinds of adaptations like camouflage and skin coverings (fur, scales, skin, feathers). The classes also started a top secret project that can't be revealed until Mother's Day! :)

<u>Social (Mrs. Rarick):</u> During the month of May we will complete our unit "Moving Forward From the Past" with a field trip to Ft. Ostell. Then we will be learning about the Landmarks of Ponoka with a field trip around our town at the end of the month.

DPA/Health (Miss Longjohn): We have finished working on our balance and rhythmic movement using a variety of equipment. The students had a lot of fun working on the mission imPOSSIBLE activities. We are continuing to work on some hand eye coordination using the foam paddles and balls. The month of May will have a strong focus on working on the skills needed for Run, Jump and Throw activities. I will be sending out the date for the Grade I Run, Jump, Throw later this month.
